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1.0 General Information

VENUE Sorrento Beach, CENTRAL (Carnival)
& Sorrento Surf Life Saving Club (BBQ lunch)

- Ample parking for buses and vehicles near surf club
- Surf Life Saving Club Kiosk available for coffee and snacks

COST Costs for the day will be shared amongst participating schools which include beach / council booking, courtyard hire, lifeguard support and BBQ lunch

2.0 Nomination of students

Any student with a disability (Years 7 to 12), whether enrolled in an Education Support unit or not, is eligible to attend. Beach Carnival nominations are to be received by the ACC office no later than: **Friday 7 February 2025**

** Late nominations will not be accepted.

Please note that in the nomination form, as provided by the ACC must be uploaded as part of your online nomination form. Please also include any particular student groupings you would like and/or any students you would like separated.

3.0 Supervision

Schools nominating students must make arrangements for adequate supervision.

Schools are to provide a minimum of 1:10 staff to student ratio (ACC general recommendation)

Schools are to supply a minimum of **1 Surf Rescue Qualified Staff Member**, who will not only be responsible for the supervision of their own school, but the supervision of all students participating in the event.

SORRENTO SURF LIFESAVING CLUB

- Full time Lifeguards on beach
- Surf Rescue equipment
- IRB and First Aid Room availability

HOST SCHOOL DUTY (SACRED HEART COLLEGE)

- Host school to provide extra mainstream students to assist with the running of the day.
- Host school requested to bring additional shade for schools if they are able, along with body boards for the Ironman events
- Students are to arrive at **8:45am**, for set up of marquees on beach, flags, activity and ironman area and markings.

- School staff member to take on the role of CHIEF SURF RESCUE SUPERVISOR, to provide a briefing to all SRS prior to the Iron man events, and to support in the allocation of student volunteers to their roles for the event
- School supervising staff are required to assist with students needs throughout the day.
- Host school volunteers to cook and prepare BBQ lunch for all in attendance at the Sorrento Surf Lifesaving Club
- Host school students are to remain behind at end to clear beach area and pack away all equipment

4.0 First Aid

- First Aid provider has been engaged, and will be on site for the duration of the event.
- It is the school's responsibility to bring specific first aid requirements that students in their care require.
- Students receiving first aid care from facility staff **must** be under the supervision of a staff member and ensure that their relevant case history and specific needs are communicated to the facility staff.

5.0 Spectators

Spectators are to be supervised by staff at all times and are encouraged to participate in activities on the day: however, spectators do so at their risk.

6.0 Shade and equipment

- The venue has two permanent shade structures in place, however shelter under these will be on a first come first served basis. Schools are encouraged to bring their own to ensure adequate shaded area for their students, along with ground cover.
- In the event the weather forecast for the day is extreme or inclement, the ACC Sport Operations Manager, Inclusion will SMS all Inclusive Sports Coordinators, and advise accordingly by 8:30am on the morning of the carnival.
- Schools are asked to bring their own body boards for their students to participate / compete in the Ironman events
- Per the format of the day, and noted below, schools will be required to bring equipment to deliver their nominated activity for the day

7.0 Format of the day

Schools to arrive on location by **no later than 9:30am** to setup and erect any marquees, shade, and provisions.

- 9:45am the ACC Sport Operation Manager, Inclusion formally welcomes and addresses all schools in attendance and usher the participants to the starting line for the Ironman Events.
- 10:05am A starting airhorn will sound and mark the commencement of the first scheduled Ironman event, with the courses pre-marked. Participants will endeavour to :
 - make their way to the water
 - wade a short distance to water safety officials
 - swim a short distance, in line with the beach
 - wade back to shore
 - collect a body board
 - return to the water
 - use the board to paddle a short distance, in line with the beach
 - body board back to the beach
 - return the body board
 - make their way long the sand to the finish line

NOTE : there is no nomination required for the Ironman Events. There will be four events offered being:

BOYS IRONMAN ENTICER EVENT	}	<i>this is a shorter course for both the land and water elements (standing depth in water)</i>
GIRLS IRONMAN ENTICER EVENT		
BOYS IRONMAN PURSUIT EVENT	}	<i>this is a longer course than the enticer events, for both the land and water elements</i>
GIRLS IRONMAN PURSUIT EVENT		

- Students finishing the Ironman Events in 1st – 3rd place will receive a medallion for their respective placing
NOTE : to ensure all students have the opportunity to participate, can we please ensure that students who partake in the pursuit event, DO NOT also partake in the enticer events
- 10:35am Conclusion of the Ironman events we will have a morning tea break.
- Students will then rotate between activity stations in designated groups as detailed within the event program, with each activity being 15 minutes.
- Each school attending on the day will be responsible for providing at least one activity, for the group rotations. The required number of staff from this school, **are to remain and deliver the activity** for the duration of this time and for all rotations.

- Once nominations have been closed, schools will be allocated an activity accordingly, with examples being sand sculpture contest, sponge and bucket relay, boogie boarding, beach volleyball.

NOTE : It is the responsibility of each school to bring all appropriate equipment for their allocated activity.

- 12pm Pack up with the assistance of the host school will commence
- From 12:30pm BBQ lunch for all students and teachers will be held in the Sorrento Surf Club undercover area (assisted by HOST school volunteers)
